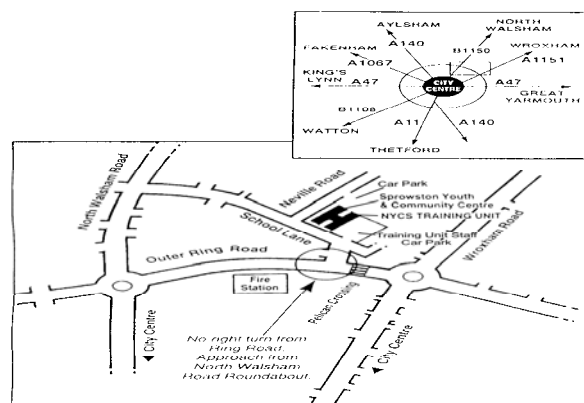

Millennium Volunteers

Norfolk CVYS Development Worker, Mike Tingley, recently visited the Millennium Volunteers and was very interested to discover what Millennium Volunteers is about. Mike thought other member organisations would like to know as well.

What is Millennium Volunteers ?

The Millennium Volunteers Project is for people aged 16-24. The idea is that young people get involved with, or start up projects which benefit the community whilst doing something that is enjoyable. That means that you have ideas about what you want to do.

You will get support from your project workers who will help you fill out your plan, try to find suitable volunteering opportunities, and help you sort out any problems you might face in your volunteering.

What are the benefits of being a Millennium Volunteer ?

Millennium Volunteers is being recognised by employers and colleges. This means that all the different skills you build up working on and/or running projects such as team working, confidence, communication and organisational skills (which are just the sort of things employers are looking for) will be recognised and appreciated. You get milestone certificates on reaching 1200 hours and then on completing 200 hours you will gain an Award of Excellence signed by the Secretary of State. The 100 and 200 hour awards also look good on CVs and in achievement folders. On top of this you are learning a number of different skills which might relate to the work you eventually want to do.

A MV Award can also count towards the service section of the Duke of Edinburgh's Award.

Norfolk Drug and Alcohol Action Team (DAAT) is a strategic body set up under the UK Government's Strategy for England "Tackling Drugs Together". The DAAT is a partnership of the following agencies, Education, Social Services, Police, Health, the Prison Service, Probation Service, Youth Offending Team, Connexions, local authorities and Norfolk Drug and Alcohol Service Providers.



Through working in partnership Norfolk DAAT aims to implement the Updated Drug Strategy 2002 at a local level. This is done through the commissioning and monitoring of services, raising awareness about drug and alcohol issues at a local level and supporting member agencies through training and workforce development.

A team of people administer the work of the DAAT, each with their own area of responsibility. One of the priority areas for the DAAT is Young People. Services for young people across the county include education, information and raising awareness, prevention, harm minimisation and treatment.

The DAAT has commissioned two young people's specialist substance misuse agencies T² and Impact.



is a partnership of the Matthew Project, NYCS and MAP. T² works with identified vulnerable young people under the age of 19, providing targeted prevention programmes that include specialist advice, information, counselling and practical support on drugs, alcohol and associated issues. The team also complete holistic assessments of need, identifying and referring young people to specialist services including Impact.



is the county's young people's substance misuse treatment service. It is a multi-agency, multi-disciplinary team that provides specialist treatment services for young people under 20 who have complex drug and alcohol related needs and whose use and misuse of drugs, alcohol and solvents is having a significant impact on their development. The team works peripatetically so they can give a flexible, comprehensive and responsive service.

Norfolk DAAT also provide a range of training across the county, dates for the Drug and Alcohol Awareness course are contained within the Norfolk CVYS Events and Training Opportunities Diary 2004.
