In January 2006 it was estimated that a total number of asylum seekers and refugees and other displaced people in Asia reached 6.1 million, Africa 4.2 million, Europe approximately 4.2 million, Latin America and Caribbean approximately 1.3 million, North America 978, 000 and Oceania 75, 000. It is estimated that there are a total of 17 million extremely vulnerable people around the world due to levels of violence in areas of conflict<sup>1</sup>. This reflects the level of disorder and uncertainty which has serious human security and development consequences for many in the world.

The few asylum seekers and refugees that actually make it to 'safe' countries face racism, many are victims of hate crime and though they contribute in many positive ways most stories that people hear portray them in a negative manner, the Daily Mail has done this systematically. Yet a closer look at Karl Marx, Albert Einstein and Madeleine Albright amongst many others, will challenge some of the most common stereotypes that people have formed about refugees and their contributions to society.

This year refugee week will take place between the 19<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> June. Various events have been organised for all to participate in throughout the week, please refer to following page for details. There will be many opportunities to celebrate culture, enjoy food and music from all over the world and learn more about refugees. 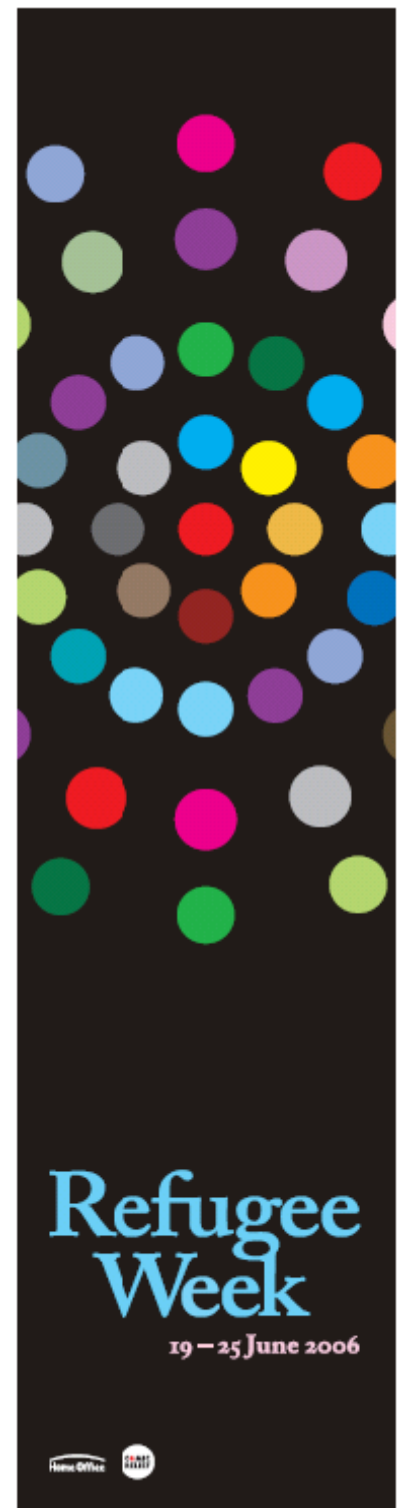

The General Assembly on 17 December 1999 in its resolution 54/120, endorsed the recommendation made by the World Conference of Ministers Responsible for Youth (Lisbon, 8-12 August 1998) that 12 August be declared International Youth Day. The Assembly recommended that public information activities be organized to support the Day as a way to promote better awareness of the World Programme of Action for Youth to the Year 2000 and Beyond, adopted by the General Assembly in 1995 (resolution 50/81).

This year will be Norfolk's first celebration of International Youth Day. Our aim is to:

**Organise** - Hold forums, public discussions and information campaigns in support of young people focusing on youth issues and how they can be addressed. I would like to hear about feedback from young people that you work with on these issues and collect statements for exhibitions and discussion leading up to International Youth Day. Please let me know if you would be willing to hold a forum at you organisation for such discussions prior to International Youth Day.

**Celebrate** - Plan and organise performances everywhere to showcase - and celebrate - the fact that youth contribute to the societies in which they live. Convene exchanges and dialogues focusing on the rich and varied skills, interests and aspirations of young people. If you know young people who would be interested in performing an event in their area please let us know.

**Take action** - A major focus of the day is practical action to further encourage the empowerment and participation of youth in the processes and decisions that affect their lives. 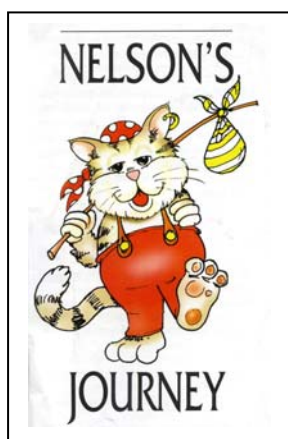

### Spotlight on.....



**Nelson's Journey** is a registered charity for bereaved children and young people in Norfolk.

#### Who does Nelson's Journey help ?

Sadly, there will always be children in Norfolk who experience the death of a parent, brother, sister, close relative or other significant person in their lives through illness, accident, suicide and occasionally through murder. Statistics suggest that each year approximately 280 children in Norfolk are likely to experience the death of someone very close to them.

#### How can Nelson's Journey help bereaved children ?

Nelson's Journey helps bereaved children between the ages of 6-14 years, by bringing them together on residential weekend camps. By participation in the weekend, the children learn that they are not alone in their experience and that their feelings of grief are shared by others. The weekend camp involves a combination of fun and games, outdoor activities and opportunities to remember the person who has died.

The children have the opportunity to express their feelings through creative and physical activities in a safe and supported environment. We are currently able to run two residential weekends per year for up to 25 children on each weekend. Nelson's Journey also arranged special days, bringing together bereaved young people, aged 14-17 years. We hope in the future to run more camps and to develop other services such as support groups and individual work with children and their families. The charity aims to complement the work of both statutory and local voluntary organisations.

#### Does Nelson's Journey involve the whole family ?

Nelson's Journey recognises that the death of a close relative not only affects the children, but can have a devastating effect upon the whole family. Although we are a charity for children, the parents/carers are kept fully informed about our work and are very involved in the assessment visits. We are able to offer advice about other support services if required.

Nelson's Journey plans to arrange social events during the year to enable children, families, volunteers and workers to meet again and renew acquaintances.

### **Volunteering**

- The majority of young people are turned off by volunteering initiatives unless they can help development them, UK Youth will say in a report due out shortly.
- Volunteering charity v will offer financial support to organisations that use the Youth Achievement Award to accredit youth volunteering.  
UK Youth, which developed the award, is offering a series of training days across the country to help organisations deliver it. The sessions are part of Ready, Steady, Go, a programme run by v to support organisations working with young people. Other themes covered are designing and developing programmes, media and communications to reach young people, building successful partnerships with other groups and attracting support from business.

### **Youth Trends**

#### Diversity in young shows in survey

Young 'cool geeks' and 'urbos'; are on the rise and 'chavs' are dying out, according to new research. *Teenage Tribes 2006*, a report being compiled by youth research agency Dubit, suggests that more than a third of 11-17 year olds shun mainstream brands and are driven by integrity and individual expression. 'Moshers', creative and moral types driven by music lyrics who avoid the mainstream, are identified as the largest group, at 18% per cent of young people.

'Cool geeks', a group that has emerged since Dubit's last study 4 years ago, are the second largest, at 17%. They are defined as young people driven by personal integrity. One in 10 young people analysed are 'urbos' – ethnically diverse, driven by trends and into clubbing, football and dance. They outnumber chavs who make up 9%. The other groups are Goths (6%), techies (10%), socialites (11%), sporties (10%) and geeks (8%). Dubit's study is based on about 2000 11-17 year olds. ### **Antisocial behaviour**

Youth Workers need to be more involved in planning interventions to improve neighbourhoods and deal with antisocial behaviour, according to a report from spending watchdog the Audit Commission. **Neighbourhood crime and antisocial behaviour** which launched on the 17<sup>th</sup> May, says that council-wide attempts to record crime and antisocial behaviour often fail to identify specific areas of the community where there are problems.
