To date all localities are processing a good number of applications and many grants have been awarded.

Groups are receiving support to develop their projects, buy equipment to help run projects and indeed at least one group has secured funding to employ a worker. CRB (Criminal Records Bureau) Checks - updates

Norfolk CVYS provides CRB checking for member organisations at both standard and enhanced levels for £7.50 each for each volunteer. Additional charges apply to those paid employees within the voluntary sector and we are able to provide you with further information on request.

How long does a CRB Check take?

As at August 2007, we are experiencing about 3-5 weeks to complete CRB applications. CRB's are affected by a number of factors which can influence the time they take to complete. For example you can expect longer delays if the applicant has lived at several addresses in different counties. Our record return, to date, remains at 8 days (yes eight days!) for an enhanced level check.

If a check is not back in 60 days then we are required to inform the CRB who will issue an 'accelerator notice' to the agency causing the delay, to speed things up. Applicants should be reassured that if checks do take a long time, it is in no way a reflection on information held about them but is likely to be linked to the work load of either the CRB or the police both of whom experience occasional periods of high volume.

On-line tracking

CRB applicants can now see how their check is progressing by going to the CRB website at www.crb.gov.uk clicking on the 'quick links' box, select 'online tracking', press 'go' then scroll down to the bottom of the page and click on 'Click here to use the tracking service'. You will then need to enter your Form reference number (which starts with F then 10 digits) plus your date of birth and you will then be shown your progress indicator. Unfortunately disclosure checks are usually delayed at stage 4 (records held by the Police).

Trustee CRB Checks

The Charity Commission has removed the requirement for Criminal Record Bureau checks for trustees of some organisations. Organisations affected include those working with vulnerable adults or children. Board members will instead be asked to sign declarations confirming whether checks have been carried out. The change will take effect in late September early October, and guidance will be published in the autumn. Contact the Commission for more information. <http://www.charitycommission.gov.uk>.

CRB does U-turn on volunteer checks

The Criminal Records Bureau (CRB) has abandoned plans to tighten its definition of volunteering to reduce the number of people eligible for free checks.

The bureau was considering re-wording its definition to clarify who can receive checks free of charge, and there were some concerns that young volunteers would lose out as a result, (*YPN* 21-27 February p3).

But last week Vince Gaskell, chief executive of the CRB, told *Young People Now* there were no longer any plans to apply a redefinition.

A Home Office spokeswoman said free checks are subsidised by fee-paying customers. "The CRB continually audits those customers who apply for free-of-charge checks to ensure that the post meets our definition of a volunteer," she said. "The CRB is always looking at ways to ensure customers understand the definition and did at one stage consider if re-wording would add greater clarity.
